Social worker left with brain damage after beam falls on her head.

The family of a Scio Township social worker who suffered brain damage when a beam fell on her head while she was attending a gardening class in a Washtenaw County-owned building is suing the county for \$5.75 million.

The lawsuit filed Wednesday in Washtenaw Circuit Court says Gil Anne Crisman-McQuarrie, 45,

McQuarrie, 45, was injured Feb. 6, 1997, during a course at the Washtenaw

County Service Center, at 4133 Washtenaw Ave. in Pittsfield Township.

Crisman-McQuarrie was sitting in class between master gardening class

lectures offered through Michigan State University Cooperative Services when the wood ceiling beam fell, the suit said.

Crisman-McQuarrie continues to undergo rehabilitation at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, the suit said.

Oaldand County attorney David L. Moffitt, who is representing Crisman-McQuarrie in the lawsuit, said she "had significant career potential and was considered a dynamo by her co-workers and community volunteer colleagues.
